CHECKLIST FOR HOMEOWNERS FOR RELOCATION

The following is a checklist that will be helpful when you contact a mover when your manufactured or mobile home will be relocated or demolished. You should discuss with the mover what will and will not be included in the mover's scope of work.

 Preparing the home to move, installing wheels/axles, breaking down (Double Wide)
 Demolition or removal permit, and hauling permit if needed by the County
 Placement permits and fees for the new replacement
 Cleaning/clearing the old home site
 Hauling of the home to the new site
 Footers installed per building code and inspection of same
 Blocking and leveling of the home, marrying the two halves (Double Wide)
 Contacting the new utility companies to turn on service at the new location, and any fees for the same
 Utilities connected (water, sewer, electric, gas bottles/oil tanks, based on the home by plumber, electrician, HVAC contractors).
 HVAC move, pump down AC, and reinstall at new location
 Skirting install (new skirting or re-use old?) Typically, the old won't be the correct lengths, so new is usually the way to do this
 Steps (re-use old vs. new)? They must comply with current code, so new are typically the way to go here as well

CHECKLIST FOR HOMEOWNERS FOR RELOCATION/DEMOLITION

 Oil to gas conversion, if required by the new community
 Will Mover provide Certificate of Occupancy prior to homeowner moving in?
